Pro-Life Activities by Maxine Julian

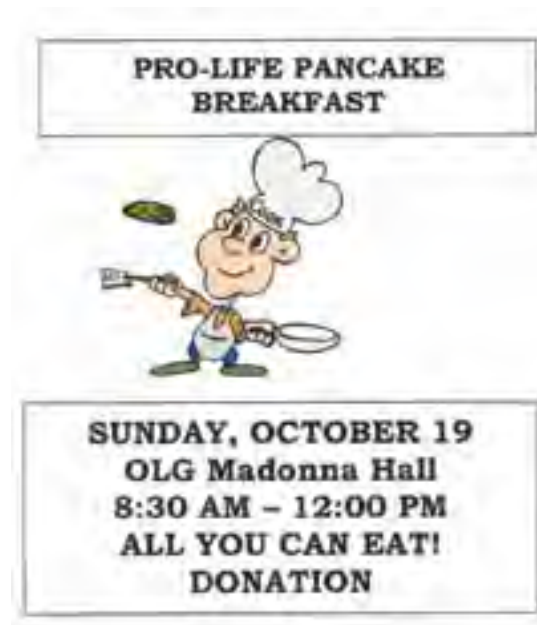
The annual Life Chain in Sunday, October 5th, 2-2:30 pm, at Trinity High School, 17 th & Lorraine.

A pro-life pancake breakfast is planned for Sunday, October 19th, 8:30- 12:00. Please plan to attend.

OLG Advent Church School

Advent Church School for children ages 3-5 will begin at a new time. Classes will start October 7th at 9:00 til 10:30 am. Each class consists of hearing a story, making cookies that illustrate the story and also making an ornament that illustrates the story.

At the end of the 10-week session children decorate the Christmas tree in the adoration chapel. They also take home the ornaments they made for their own Christmas tree.

The stories are arranged to lead up to Christmas and the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Included in each lesson plan is a visit to God's House, a take home leaflet and songs and action play and of course a snake.

Teachers and helpers are always welcomed and needed. This is a particular good opportunity for parents, grandparents, godparents and even that special baby-sitter to share the faith with their little one. Many who are attending RCIA have appreciated this program as it explains many Catholic traditions.

February 2nd, 2015 will mark 20 years of Perpetual Adoration of the Holy Eucharist at Our Lady of Guadalupe!! We started with approximately 269 individual adorers. During this time we have lost 79 adorers - 90% were among the first to commit to spending an hour with Jesus.

Today we have about 205 individuals covering the 168 hours, of which 11 might have 2 to 4 hours a week. Please come and spend your special time with our Lord.
