Tres Domingo en el Tiempo Ordinario
Neh 8: 2-4A, 5-6, 8-10 / 1 Cor 12: 12-30 / Lk 1: 1-4; 4: 14-21

Algunas personas luchan con un sentido de pertenencia, particularmente en la iglesia. Parece haber esta creencia de que, para pertenecer, tienes que estar al frente y al centro, y para algunas personas, el frente y el centro son un lugar muy incómodo para estar. Recuerda esto: un discípulo es, ante todo, uno que sigue. Como discípulo misionero, eres miembro de un grupo de personas: los cristianos bautizados del mundo. En su carta a los corintios, Pablo nos recuerda que no tenemos que ser una "mano" para pertenecer al cuerpo ... "hay muchas partes, pero un cuerpo". Por lo tanto, no es posible que el cuerpo ignore a uno de sus miembros, ni es posible que uno de los miembros niegue la pertenencia al cuerpo. En su lugar, debemos ayudarnos unos a otros a descubrir nuestros talentos. Debemos animarnos unos a otros y estar agradecidos unos con otros. "Si una parte sufre, todas las partes sufren con ella; si una parte es respetada, todas las partes comparten su alegría".

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

"He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up." Did you grow up in a small town? Whenever you see stories of tight-knit communities, a common refrain is that everybody knows everybody and that's very difficult to change. If you leave and return, people expect you to be and act a certain way, and it's strange for them if you do not. In today's Gospel, we see that Jesus was already moving "in the power of the Spirit and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He...was praised by all." His ministry has begun! News of his growing popularity must have proceeded him to Nazareth. Upon his arrival, he "went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day." For the first few moments, he is what they expect - their hometown boy returning to pay his respects. As was common of men at the time, he takes a turn reading a passage of Sacred Scripture. It is a bold passage, one he selects intentionally. "He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written: The Spirit of the Lord is upon me." After reading about holy anointings, liberation for the poor and prisoners, and physical healings, Jesus does the unthinkable. "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

We are all called to imitate Christ wherever we are. This might mean doing the unexpected! All too often we're content with the daily status quo, and so are the people around us. When we take a stand for Christian values, change our lifestyle to reflect the Gospel, and work for justice in society, we may make others uncomfortable. But Jesus doesn't call us to the same life we lived yesterday or the year before that. He is calling all of us - each and every one of us - to deeper conversion of heart. No matter what other people expect, will you love in the Spirit of the Lord today?

"Fully Alive as Missionary Disciples" Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Neh 8: 2-4A, 5-6, 8-10/1 Cor 12: 12-30 / Lk 1: 1-4; 4: 14-21

Some people struggle with a sense of belonging, particularly in church. There seems to be this belief that in order to belong, you have to be front and center and for some people, front and center is a very uncomfortable place to be. Remember this: a disciple is first and foremost, one who follows. As a missionary disciple, you are a member of a body of people -- the baptized Christians of the world. In his letter to the Corinthians, Paul reminds us that we don't have to be a "hand" in order to belong to the body... "there are many parts, yet one body." Therefore, it is not possible for the body to disregard one of its members, nor is it possible for one of the members to deny belonging to the body. Instead, we must help one another discover our talents. We must encourage one another and be grateful for one another. "If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy."
